Born of Scottish parents in 1854 in Nova Scotia, he moved to Boston at 21, 1875. He converted in 1877; went to Chicago in 1882, and entered McCormick Theological Seminary in 1883 (B.D., 1886). In 1889 began writing gospel hymns. His popularity was primarily in the 1910s and 20s.
