Advent 2018 | Light in the Darkness

The season of Advent, which comes comes from the Latin word *adventus* meaning "coming" or "visit," begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year for Christians.

During Advent, we prepare for, and anticipate, the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for, and need of, forgiveness, salvation and a new beginning. Even as we look back and celebrate the birth of Jesus in a humble stable in Bethlehem, we also look forward anticipating the second coming of Christ as the fulfillment of all that was promised by his first coming. In Advent, we recognize that we live in the tension of waiting and anticipating, remembering and hoping. As we remember the story of Jesus, as John describes it as a light coming into the darkness; we look for the light in the darknesses of today.

We're celebrating our hope-full anticipation and incarnational vocation in many ways this Advent Season:

- 1. In worship with creative liturgy on the 4 Advent Sundays
- 2. With weekly Advent Dinners in the homes of different community members on Sunday evenings 7-9pm: a simple potluck dinner with the lighting of the Advent Wreath and a chance to just *be* together in a busy season
- 3. Weekly advent crafts for kids (and grown-up kids) after worship on Sundays stayed tuned for info! Starts 12/2
- 4. A special daily digital devotional throughout the season
- 5. Decorating our usual space into one filled with light and warmth pointing to our shared hope. *Help us bring all of our decorations down from storage next Sunday, 11/25 after worship.* Then Come help decorate Tuesday, November 27th 8am-12pm putting up trees and lights.
- 6. We're collecting news toys to contribute to the annual Harbor House Christmas Store. Find a flyer in the entryway and/or talk with Linda Davis.
- 7. We're soliciting needed gifts via our Deacons' Christmas Tree. Talk to Deacons Bill Beatty & Ben Bencomo.
