We pass the peace weekly using languages native to the cultures of our church community as an audible sign of the Dominion of God at work towards the healing transformation of the world.

Thoughts on Today's Scripture 1 Corinthians 1:1-9

First Corinthians is the first of several pastoral letters of encouragement and help that the apostle Paul wrote to the ancient Christian community in Corinth. It was a large, diverse port-city in which people of different cultures, classes, ethnicities and religious world-views lived and encountered one another. The community there seems to have been plagued with clashes and conflicts around racial supremacy, class superiority, and an hierarchical notion of community transposed from the secular culture onto the community of those who found life in following Jesus as Christ.

Today we read the first verses of this long letter. They follow the traditional way of formulating a salutation in both the ancient world and what Ms. Manner's might recommend today. Greet

FOREVER GOD FAITHFUL

those to whom you're writing, recognize and restate your relationship, and then summarize why you're writing. Here Paul does just that, establishing the identity of the apostle and his addressees. Then everything that follows is founded upon these identity descriptions; God is the one who calls, and the church, not just at Corinth, but everywhere, is the community of people who respond by calling on the name of Jesus Christ. Those who participate in the convent community are the recipients of God's freely given mercy, and they therefore stand within the sphere of God's peace, a peace that should extend to their relationships with one another." ((Richard B. Hays. First Corinthians: Interpretation Commentary. p. 17)

They're not called to tolerate each other, nor to help each other. They're called to be holy together, living out their faith, living into the example of Christ, in their life together – at worship, when the gather for potlucks, when they do social action, community service, when they live their life of faith in the public sphere. They become focused on who is better or the best at this or that task. Paul writes to remind them that it's more about who they are, who they are in Christ, then about what they may be able to do.

Questions for the practice of Examen & Contemplation

- What grabs your attention in this reading?
- What does it mean to be called for you?; to what are you/we called?
- What does it mean to be a saint, to be holy? How do you struggle with seeing yourself as holy?
- How do testify to God's faithfulness, proclaiming the Love of Christ, in our life together as a community of faith? How might God be calling us to do so today and in the near-future?





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Spirit of God, Descend upon My Heart

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
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This reflection on Galatians 5:25 was written by a literary Anglican clergyman whose preaching drew people of many social classes to one of the formerly poorer London churches. The tune was created for "Abide with Me" (no. 836) but more often appears with the present text.
