## Thoughts on Today's Scripture Mark 5:1-20

This summer we're working with the notion of bearing testimony, sharing stories of how we have individually experienced the presence, purpose or passion of God in our lives. It's a chance to



remember, retell and reclaim that God is alive, wild and loose in the world still creating, redeeming and resurrecting. It's also a chance for us to discover and reconnect with our own importance, with the notion that our story matters in the larger story of the universe. How do we share those stories? How do such stories of deliverance, hope and love encourage in a time characterized by social isolation, mistrust of institutions and others, and a deep search for meaning?

This story in Mark is undoubtedly connected to the story of Jesus delivering another man from an unclean spirit in Mark 1:21-28. That is the inaugural, or first, miraculous act of deliverance recounted by Mark. These two stories are the only ones in which an unclean spirit talks with Jesus, recognizing Jesus for who he is. We all too often forget that the name Jesus is a form of the Jewish name Joshua which means "Yahweh rescues, delivers or saves!"

When we read of a person with an unclean spirit in the Bible we often think immediately of demon possession. Many historians point out that in the ancient world folks with mental illnesses such as epilepsy or various mental illnesses were thought of as possessed by foreign spirits. Curiously the literal wording means an "unclean, unhealthy or un-natural spirit/breath. The creation story of Genesis talks of human life springing from the gift of God's breath (or spirit – remember it's the same word!) within us. So an Unclean Spirit is literally life that is the opposite of what God intended and created.

Here the man with a an un-god-desired breath lives among the dead dominated by an power which resists God's plan. He's as good as dead. Jesus brings him back to life, delivering him from a foreign occupying power through resurrection: the restoration of the holy breath God gave in creation. The man then wants to stay with Jesus, but is sent back to his own home. He's not rejected, but rather sent as the first missionary, to bear witness to how he has experienced God's deliverance and saving presence in his own life.

## Questions for the practice of Examen & Contemplation

- What grabs your attention in this reading?
- What does Jesus do for the man living among the tombs?
- How is God actively present in Jesus? How have you experienced the deliverance of God – as this man did – through an encounter with Jesus?
- What do you think the man did next? How are you invited to "go home and tell your friends of what the Lord has done for you"?
