# Thoughts on Today's Scripture Romans 8:28-39

Today's passage comes from the seminal theological letter of the Apostle Paul written for the early church in Ancient Rome. Struggling to understand faith, and to grasp how those who came from a Jewish background and those who did not, could combine into one community of faith, Paul articulates what it means to have a life in Christ by faith, and to be one in Christ.



Chapter 8 is in some sorts the climactic chapter of the letter.

Paul writes to the theological uncertainty of God's sovereignty in relationship to the question of theodicy. In normal English, Paul writes of how we can trust that God is both all-powerful and all-good when we faces evil, injust, and/or horrible situations. The early Christians faced situations of political and economic persecution for choosing Christian faith. They also faced societal and familial isolation because of their new faith-based identity. Undoubtedly they also faced the myriad of overwhelming situations we face today as well: cancer, broken relationships, poverty, death.

Paul talks of the gigantesque size of God's heart, a love that is so deep and wide that it overwhelms – wether good or bad. It's not a smothering love, but a rigorous love that covers us like a rising tide raises any and all the boats moored in that area. It's a love which covers and delivers, which binds and unties, that we might glimpse the goodness of God in life in moments for which we are most grateful and those that we dread with every ounce of our being – and all those inbetween.

So what does Paul mean when he writes that "all things work togther for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose"? Does that mean only those who claim faith? Does that mean all people? To pierce this troublesome phrase we have to first ask what is the purpose of God? And whom does God purportedly love?

# Questions for the practice of Examen & Contemplation

- What grabs your attention in this reading?
- How have you experienced the mysterious power of God's love in your own life, working towards good even in worst case scenarios when everything seems lost?
- How do you struggle to trust, to perceive the good that God wills and brings into being in your life?; our life together?; our world?
- How does this scripture encourage you?
- How does it confuse you?
