
POSTLUDE "The Chicken"

Today's Reading 1 Samuel 3:1-21

The over-arching story of the Hebrew scriptures and New Testament: *our* story continues. We jump across some big stories that shape us, the remaning time in the wilderness dessert followed by the entry into the Promised Land. The leadership of Moses ends, as he is succeeded by his intern Joshua. The Hebrews settle in the land, followig the teachings of YHWH. They are governed by the Judges as they learn little by little what it means to be a holy, set-apart people. Eli becomes the head priest, and is succeeded not by his sons (as would be normal in the herdetiarty tribe-based system) who are narcissitic and use the power of the priesthood for themselves; but by Samuel - a miracle child who is born to a long-barren woman (see 1 Samuel 1-2). In our reading today we hear of Samuel as he grows from a child into an adult, and as his faith becomes less child-like in an encoutner with God. It's a story about growing in faith, hearing God and choosing to listen to God as life-affirming source of vocation and grace.

Today we're listening for God's voice in the scripture through the long practiced spiritual discipline of Lectio Divina (or sacred/holy reading). It's appraoching the text in faith, assuming that the story is our story, that God conitnues to speak to us in our world today – through life, experiences, and relationships and also through the sacred word of scriptrue – written, spoken

and heard. We'll read the scripture two times, followed by times of reflection and discussion. As you listen – listen less to understand the text than to understand or "hear" it as God's word for you today.



QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN VIA LECTIO DIVINA:

1st Reading 1 of the scripture:

followed by 5-7 minutes of discussion in groups of 2 or 3 people

- 1. What word, phrase or image enraged, engaged or surprised you in the text?
- 2. What is your earliest memory of church? Is there a story that goes with it?
- 3. When do you feel really listened to or heard? Is there a story of a time like that? Or maybe a time when you felt not really heard or listened to?.

2nd Reading of the scripture:

followed by 5-7 minutes of discussion in groups of 2 or 3 people

- 4. How is this story of Samuel about you?
- 5. What makes it hard for you to listen to and hear other people, or God? How would you like to change that?
