Reflections on Today's Readings Acts 10:1-35

On airplanes the flight attendants always ask you to first put your own oxygen mask on before you go to help someone else in case of an emergency. It migth seem selfish or counterintuitive. But what it's really about is seeing the larger picture. You can't help or care for others unless you're able to act yourself.



In scripture, back at the foundational story of creation we're told that we are created in the image of God, that we are called to be stewards (care-givers) of all of creation. Jesus talks of it in terms of neighborliness in his teaching of Mark 12:29-31:

²⁹ Jesus replied, "The most important one is Israel, listen! Our God is the one Lord, ³⁰ and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your being, with all your mind, and with all your strength. ³¹ The second is this, You will love your neighbor as yourself. No other commandment is greater than these."

Is an expansion upon that articulated in the Hebrew scriptures as God through Moses teaches the people how to live in a community rooted in love, mutual forebearance, and solidarity.

¹⁸ You shall not take vengeance, nor hold any grudge against your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself; Leviticus 19:18

Today's reading tells the story of a double conversion. Cornelius, a gentile (or non-Jew) is moved by the Holy Spirit and seeking Jesus as the Way. Peter, one of the foundaitonal apostles, is sent by the Holy Spirit to minister to Cornelius. But the problem is that Peter – like all of us – is deeply shaped by his social identity. He's Jewish, has always eaten kosher and followed the misvots or laws of the commandments. To go to Cronelius, enter his home and eat with him is something he has learend his whole life to avoid and never do. He doesn't see Cornelius as his neighbor.

In the story Peter is converted, transformed – his vision expands...and he is able to see what he couldn't see before. The God Jesus points to is the God of all nations, tribes, people and social classes. Peter must change himself before he can participate in what God wants for the world, and minister to Cornelius. In a sense Peter has to put on his own oxygen mask first in order to see what he needs to do and what God is up to in the bigger picture.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:

- What engaged you, enraged you, or surprised you in this story?
- How might you need to change, recognize your own blindness (put on your own oxygen mask) in order to see more clearly what God wants?
- What invitation do you hear the Spirit of God speaking to you or to us, as a church to act, speak, be or change through this word of scripture?
