Reflections on Today's Readings Luke 2:21-40 Via Erik Erikson's Stages of Development Theory

Today we look at the story of Simeon and Anna who have been waiting to see God's promised Anointed One (Messiah) who will be freedom, justice and deliverance. They have lived their life for this. While the text is brief, they don't seem to be unfulfilled, bitter or filled with regret with how they've lived. That's in part what we're wrestling with today on the first day of a new year 2023!

Who was Erik Erickson?

Erik Erikson was an ego psychologist who developed one of the most popular and influential theories of development. While his theory was impacted by psychoanalyst Sigmund Freud's work, Erikson's theory centered on psychosocial development rather than psychosexual development.

Overview of Erikson's Stages of Development

Much like Sigmund Freud, Erikson believed that personality developed in a series of stages. But unlike Freud's theory of psychosexual stages, however, *Erikson's theory described the impact of social experience across the whole lifespan. Erikson was interested in how social interaction and relationships played a role in the development and growth of human beings.*

Erikson's theory was based on what is known as the epigenetic principle. *This principle suggests that people grow in a sequence that occurs over time and in the context of a larger community.*

Conflict During Each Stage

Each stage in Erikson's theory builds on the preceding stages and paves the way for following periods of development. In each stage, Erikson believed people experience a conflict that serves as a turning point in development.

In Erikson's view, these conflicts are centered on either developing a psychological quality or failing to develop that quality. During these times, the potential for personal growth is high but so is the potential for failure.

If people successfully deal with the conflict, they emerge from the stage with psychological strengths that will serve them well for the rest of their lives. If they fail to deal effectively with these conflicts, they may not develop the essential skills needed for a strong sense of self.

This text retells the story in Luke 2:22–39, usually called the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, which took place forty days after his birth. Mary, Joseph, and the Christ-child encounter there two devout people, Anna and Simeon, who identify this baby as the promised Messiah.
