Reflections on Today's Readings 2 Timothy 1:1-9

Our reading today is from the very beginning of the 2nd letter of pastoral advice written by the Apostle Paul to his protégé and partner in ministry, Timothy.

By the time of Timothy's ministry, things are beginning to shift if the life of the Christian community. The community is no longer associated with Judaism. The rabbinical leaders made those who were both Jewish and followers of Jesus choose at some point during the first century. What we call today "the Church" were folks first called "people of the Way" (at least according to Acts 11:26 where it's translated as "Christians"). The other big thing is a generational change. Increasingly, followers of Jesus never personally knew or experienced him, or are taught be people that hadn't. It's becoming a community that is centered around proclamation and testimony of what one has experienced. More like us than the original church; focused on words and hearing as opposed to eyes and seeing.

Paul speaks of the power of relationships in faith. Referring to Timothy's grandmother Eunice and mother Lois, he points out that relationships are the context in which we share our stories with one another.

Nathan Bransford, a current author and writing coach explains that: "Our entire worldview and memories are created out of our stories. Two people can witness the same event, process and interpret it completely differently and reach completely different conclusions about what just happened. And that's before the fluid and corrosive effects of memory take hold. The reality of the actual event, even if it was recorded on film, blurs into the past. In its

place: Stories, our way of interpreting what we have seen, which is all we have to make sense of what passes before our eyes."

Today we hear a bit of the story of Timothy that Paul calls out as a way to make sense of his call as a



minister. We also hear some of the story of Joy Barnes – which makes sense not just of "her" story, but also to our own, through which we make sense of life.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:

- What engaged, enraged, or surprised you in this text?
- If someone asked you what the story of your faith development how you experienced faith in your childhood/youth
- how would you answer?
- What invitation do you hear the Spirit of God speaking to you or to us, as a church to act, speak, be or change through this word of scripture?
