Reflections on Today's Readings John 20:19-31

Today's scripture is commonly known as the story of Doubting Thomas. Curiously though, the story never says that he's a doubter. Told only by John, this is the third time that Thomas is mentioned in the gospel. In the first (11: 16) his zealous is manifest in his willingness to



die a seeming martyr death like Lazarus. Later around the Passover table while talking with Jesus he asks Jesus to clarify his teaching. Where is he going? How will they know the way?(14:1-7). Here Thomas is seeking visual confirmation of the resurrection of Jesus. He refuses to be, or cannot be, persuaded simply by the testimony of the other disciples. He was to see Jesus himself.

Throughout Lent we've wrestling with a series of questions. Our series leading up to Easter was grounded in them. In last week's reading (20:1-18) this journey culminated in the question that Jesus asks Mary at the tomb: "Who are you looking for?"

The story of Thomas asks the question: differently, what will it take for you to trust in the one that Mary saw?; that the others saw alive? Curiously the word "doubt" isn't even in the text. It's a translation choice; verse 27 reads in the literal Greek: "do not be unbelieving, but believe" or "do not be distrusting, but trust." The word **DOUBT** is related to un-belief. Not in a disbelieving way, but in an uncertainty. The word doubt goes back to an old French word coming from the Latin *dubius* (from where we get dubious). The dub- part of the word means "two" – as int having to choose between two ways forward. Rather than disbelief, it's an uncertainty of what way to take, or what belief to trust.

I've heard this story as being about faith versus doubt (or disbelief). But maybe it's more about the questions we ask, and what it takes for us to get to a place of trust and belief? In such a scenario questions aren't an indication of doubt, but rather part of the journey to understanding.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:

- What engaged, enraged, or surprised you in this text?
- John alone includes this story about Thomas. Why?
- What does seeing have to do with believing, and believing have to do with seeing? What is John saying about faith to those like us who didn't live and see Jesus during their lifetimes, but rather encounter Jesus through the testimonies in scripture?
- What invitation do you hear the Spirit of God speaking to you or to us, as a church to act, speak, be or change through this word of scripture?
