Reflections on Today's Readings Ezekiel 37:1-11

Today we continue in our theme of Mental Health Awareness Month. We're looking at the idea of reconciliation, forgiveness, and healing, as we hear from Bishop Louis Muvunyi about the PhD work he's done around reconciliation and how to empower it as a ministry of the church and followers of Jesus in his home country of Rwanda.

In just 100 days in 1994, about 800,000 people were slaughtered in Rwanda by ethnic Hutu extremists. They were targeting members of the minority Tutsi community, as well as their political opponents, irrespective of their ethnic origin. About 85% of Rwandans are Hutus but the Tutsi minority has long dominated the country. In 1959, the Hutus overthrew the Tutsi monarchy and tens of thousands of Tutsis fled to neighboring countries, including Uganda.

A group of Tutsi exiles formed a rebel group, the Rwandan Patriotic Front (RPF), which invaded Rwanda in 1990 and fighting continued until a 1993 peace deal was agreed. On the night of 6 April 1994 a plane carrying then-President Juvenal Habyarimana, and his counterpart Cyprien Ntaryamira of Burundi - both Hutus - was shot down, killing everyone on board.

Hutu extremists blamed the RPF and immediately started a well-organized campaign of slaughter. The RPF said the plane had been shot down by Hutus to provide an excuse for the genocide.



Bishop Muvunyi is returning to Rwanda to work as chaplain at the 2 year old East African Christian College in the town of Kigali. With already 700 students in diverse fields, the college is intended to be a force for both reconciliation and unity in this post-genocide time. And as we know increasingly in our own country, reconciliation and unity are easier talked about than done – especially when a larger population is siloed and divided by tribe, race, political beliefs and worldviews.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:

- What engaged, enraged, or surprised you in these texts?
- Ezekiel writes a vision of new life coming from dead bones. How is he speaking about reconciliation?
- How do you struggle with loving others who may have visited trauma upon you?
- How do you struggle to be an agent of reconciliation?
- What invitation do you hear the Spirit of God speaking to you

 or to us, as a church to act, speak, be, or change, through
 this word of scripture?

In Hebrew the word דּוֹם or ruah can mean "spirit," "breath," and "wind".
