Reflections on Today's Readings Acts 2:1-21 and 1 Corinthians 12:3-13

Today we celebrate Pentecost: the birthday of the Church. What we now call the Church – those gathered in the name of Jesus grew out of an existing Jewish feast day. A celebration of the harvest, called the The Firsfruits or the Week of Weeks, it also came to be associated with the harvest of God's word – the gift of the Torah. According to the Hebrew Scriptures, you would go to the day of the celebration of Firstfruits, and beginning with that day, you would count off 50 days. The fiftieth day would be the Day of Pentecost. So Firstfruits is the beginning of the barley harvest and Pentecost is the celebration of the beginning of the wheat harvest. The name comes from the Greek word pentekoste which means 50th.

We celebrate the harvest and thanksgiving associated with the birthing of the Church in response to the sermon given by Peter as the Spirit of God fell upon the people and allowed them to both speak and hear the word of God in various languages. It's a celebration of community, communication, diversity and unity all connected to the purpose and presence of the Spirit of God.

We hear of the transformative and liberative presence of God's Spirit also in Paul's letter of pastoral advice to the divided church in ancient Corinth. They seemed to have been a community marked by passionate faith and also deep racial supremacy and class distinctions. This wasn't uncommon in the 1st century of our era, as the Romans divided society into two groups with regard to honor: the honestiones, or privileged and "honorable" strata of society, and the humiliones, who did not qualify for reasons of birth, lack of wealth, or education to be among the elite. Paul talks of a quite different way of structuring the community.

The Greek word for Church in the Second Testament (in particular Acts and the letters of Paul) is the word <code>Ekklesia</code>, meaning a "gathering of those summoned", in ancient Greece, assembly of citizens in a city-state. When you look at the etymology of the word we see that it's composed of the preposition <code>ek-</code> meanings out of or from; and the word <code>klesia</code> from the verb, "<code>kaleo</code>", signifying "to call" - together, literally, "to call out". So, it's a community or assembly that is called out of the normal way of being; or called to something different.

OUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:

- What engaged, enraged, or surprised you in these texts?
- How do you experience the Church as a space and community called out of the normal way we do things in the world? How is it a place of the status quo, or the ways of the world?
- These scriptures tell of the best possible way for the Church to be. How do you long for our church to be better, more of an ekklesia that we have depicted as SAFE | OPEN | REAL?
- What invitation do you hear the Spirit of God speaking to you or to us, as a church to act, speak, be, or change, through this word of scripture?
