

Reflections on Today's Readings Mark 7:1-30

My friend Scott Erickson when talking of the stories of the Bible says, "It's not a story that just happened back then...it's a story that's happening right now." Part of being open is being open to experiencing the story of Jesus and the people of God as ours: realizing that we are the people of God. Part of that is realizing that it's more true than just literal truth. Another part is realizing that we to be delivered of our own Egypts, like the Passover Haggadah reminds those who eat the meal. Did you know that the Hebrew work for Egypt is Mizraim מַּצְרֵיִם which means narrow place (as in there isn't enough room), or land of distress? We too live in Mirzraim.

Today's scripture talks about the teaching of Jesus around the ways in which the tradition of the elders has become constricting, leading to spiritual blindness. In the effort to live righteous lives, to encourage everyone to live as rightly as the priests do in applying the teachings of the Torah to daily life, the Pharisees have diminished their vision. They've "ironically made the Law into an obstacle to real encounter with God, because the means have been mistaken for the end." They're so concerned about doing this rightly and in a Godly way that they seem to have forgotten or lost sight of why God has asked the people to live in such a unique way. We then see Jesus – who maybe is challenged himself – getting a new set of eyes in terms of how he reacts to this Gentile (as in non-Jewish) woman incessantly asking him for help with her daughter.

Scott Erickson made this curious art piece about vision and resurrection, commenting upon it: "What happens when you get to the end of all that you had envisioned is that you receive a new set eyes. What happens on the other side of a death of a dream is you receive a new perspective. What is the power of dying and



resurrecting if not a new way of seeing everything?"

It speaks to me about being OPEN. We want to be people and a people that are open to tradition, but not bound or constricted by it. We want to remember the past but see the present through eyes hungering for the future.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:

- What engaged, enraged, or surprised you in these texts?
- When have you experienced vision focused on the past?
 Maybe in our life together when we've said, "we've never done it like that before." Or "We tried that, it didn't work."
- How is the Spirit giving us eyes with which to see and ears with which to hear what God is up to today? (Mt 13:16)
- What invitation do you hear the Spirit of God speaking to you *or to us* through this word of scripture?


