Reflections on Today's Readings Psalms 98 & 149

We're wrapping up our summer series in which we've wrestled with the three words we've used to describe our church

mission and ethos. They're both who we are and who we aspire to become. We've pondered what a 4th word might be that we would add. MUSICAL is one suggestion.

As human beings our existence is shaped by our bodies (physical) and spirits or minds (non-physical), and time. Music too is intimately related to body, mind, and time. Some say that "music is the supreme temporal art that may reveal to us, if we are attentive, the very pattern of our living through time." Music can awaken us to what it means to be human and provide us with language to express what is beyond expression in words.

Listening to music and making music together help us to find our place, our people, our selves. Searching for a way to belong, seeking to know who we are at the deepest level, is itself a spiritual search; and music accompanies us on this way.

Worship enables and sustains Christians as they seek to become bearers of the likeness of Christ. This is a process of growth and transformation that Protestants call sanctification, Catholics call conversion, and Orthodox call deification: it's the way that believers through grace and faith become like God. In our tradition we've prioritized the Word spoken, read and preached over music. Yet music is often what most attracts and keeps people in a church community.

The psalms we read today lift up the power of music as liturgy (remember that liturgy in Greek λειτουργία - means "the work of the people"). In a sense music, making music, singing and listening to music is our work, and the way in which God's love work on us. Curiously, or maybe tragically, many of us have experienced firsthand that nothing creates more conflict in congregations today than music.

In worship we use music several different ways: 1. It's sung by the people. 2. Sung be a leader; 3. Sung by a choir; 4. Is instrumental. We have different tastes, styles, and expectations because we're different people, with different backgrounds. And yet music is a grace through which we can recognize our shared story. Maybe that's what the psalmists and prophets are saying repeatedly that God is calling us to sing a new song.

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & EXAMEN:

- What engaged, enraged, or surprised you in these texts?
- In what type of music do you most (or least) often experience or hear God?
- How have your musical tastes changed? Why?
- How is music a big part of ministry and life together?
